L has been Have a go Harry this week. She had a go at reading the words on the coins using Fred talk. Well done L!

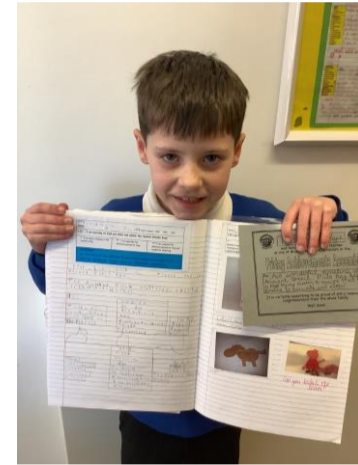

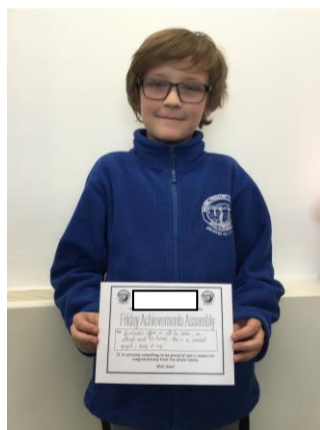


For being a great 'Have a go Harry' and trying to independently write tricky words this week.
