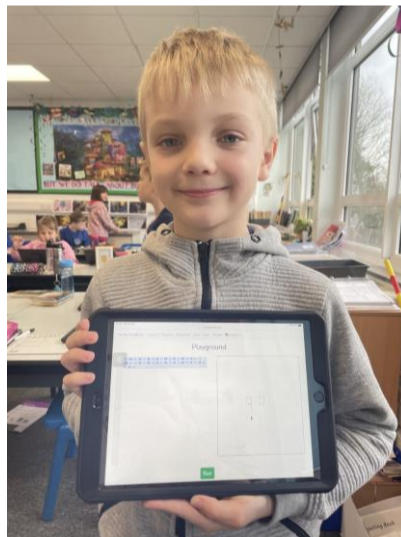
E is Downderry's achiever this week. He was brilliant at recalling facts about the Great Fire of London and the Gunpowder Plot, even after the holidays.
