Mousehole



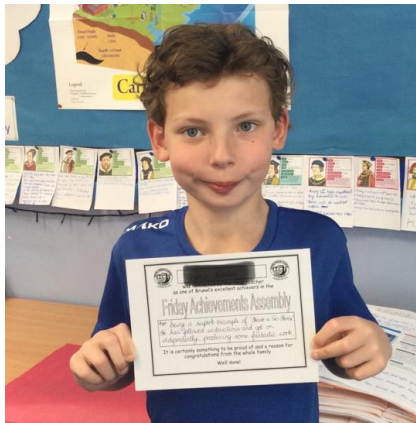

Whitsand



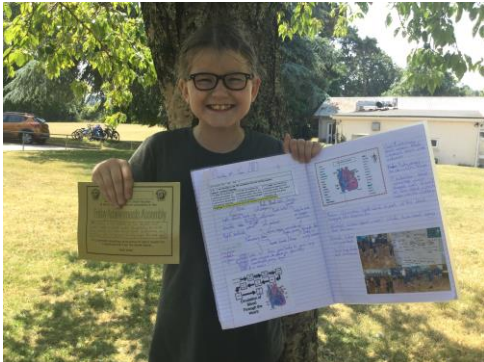
