You can use the example story map to help you come up with ideas. You can use the planning sheet on the blog to write on or write or draw all your ideas into your exercise book. Think carefully about where your full stops should go and remember to punch the air when you need one when doing the actions!  Remind yourself of the beginning, middle and end of your story ready for writing tomorrow.  Make sure you are including adjectives to describe and Time adverbs to show the order of your sentences. Make sure your story has a beginning, a middle and an end.  Please send a photo of your finished writing via email to me.	Spend today:  Finishing off your story if you haven't already  Read it out loud to an adult in a clear speaking voice.  Go through the success ladder on the blog together with an adult – what have you done well, what do you need to improve?  Ask your child to tell you the symbols we use for marking how well they've done on the success ladder – they should remember!  If you have not spelt certain words correctly – have a go at writing these out times each to practise for next time.  Challenge: Can you copy you story up with illustrations and neat handwriting to show of your writing!
