Here you need to jot down how your character lands in the Stone Age – where are they when they fall and what happens?</p> <p>The next 3 boxes are for the main events. What activities do they get up to? Have they met someone? What do they do together? The third of those boxes needs to be the climax of the story, for example the bear in the cave or some other dangerous interaction.</p> <p>In the ending box, you need your character to fall back into the present day. How do they fall? Where do they wake up? What do they realise? What do they become as an adult because of their adventure?</p> <p>The final 2 boxes are for useful words, so have a think what adverbials and adjectives you could use.</p>	<p>Year 3: <i>Multiply by 3</i> <a href="#">Aut3.11.1 - Multiply by 3 on Vimeo</a></p> <p>Year 4: <i>Divide 2d by 1d (3)</i> <a href="https://vimeo.com/497601665">https://vimeo.com/497601665</a></p> <p><i>If you want a further challenge in Maths, go to your Files section and you'll see these!</i></p>	<p><b>Computing</b> <i>How do digital devices help us?</i></p> <p>You'll need a basic graphics program, e.g. Microsoft Paint (Windows), JS Paint jspaint.app (online), PaintZ paintz.app (online) or Brushes Redux (free app for iOS devices, downloadable from the Apple App Store)</p> <p>During this lesson, we will be comparing the use of digital devices and non-digital tools. You will be producing the same piece of art using physical materials, such as paint, and using a digital device. Look at the image of Van Gogh's <i>Starry Night</i>, which you can use as a stimulus for the activity. Begin! Use the worksheet after completing your two pieces of art, to review and compare them.</p> <p>Are there times when it's better to use non-digital as opposed to digital?</p>	<p><b>RE</b> <i>How the trinity can be represented in different ways</i></p> <p>Look at these paintings: <a href="#">Andrea del Verrocchio: The Baptism of Christ (artbible.info)</a> and <a href="#">Paolo Veronese: The Baptism of Jesus (artbible.info)</a></p> <p>Christians believe God is three in one: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. They sometimes describe the Trinity according to their different roles: God the Father and Creator, God the Son and Saviour, and God the Holy Spirit as the presence and power of God at work in all life today.</p> <p>Now list ways in which these pictures show this belief.</p> <p>Then complete the worksheet.</p>
